focused on educational measures to cope with the problem of sexually transmitted infections.

Griffith said education is not enough to prevent the dangers associated with sexual activity.

"We know from nationwide statistics that you have to provide people with a convenient means of protecting themselves," she said. "A lot of college students do all types of things spontaneously, and I think sometimes there is a spontaneity to a sexual encounter, which means that often it is not planned and not prepared for.'

Griffith and the HIV/AIDS Committee have not approached A&M President Dr. Ray M. Bowen and the HIV/AIDS Committee about the proposal, but thinks a student-driven initiative would be far can get this done," she said.
