The report classified personal vehicles as the "least desirable" mode of transportation to and on campus and warned that the practice of commodating commuters adding parking spaces threaten the beauty and ambience of campus into an asphalt jungle.

"The pedestrian-oriented landscape encourages informal, individual and social interaction; provides a serenity conducive to thought, reflection and creativity; attracts students; and sweetens the memories of graduates. Our pedestrian-oriented campus is, in other words, a priceless asset," the report states.

No. 1 on the task force's agenda is dealing with the railroad tracks on Wellborn Road that separate main and West Campus. The tracks cannot be moved, panel recommends the construction of a second pedestrian way (in addition to the one planned at Joe Routh Boulevard).

To make crossing the campus foot more convenient, the report suggests repairing uneven sidewalks and installing personal lockers at central locations where students can rent to store umbrellas, books and other heavy loads.

Bicycles are a great way to get around campus, the report says. The task force recommends creating conflict among bicyclists, pedestrians and motorists, by having designated bicycle paths throughout campus and wider bike lanes on streets.

To remedy the inadequate number of bike racks, the task force suggests installing more racks near hubs such as residence halls, stops and academic buildings.

At the center of the panel's bus access plan is an overhaul of the transit system. Some of the recommendations are that buses older than this year's fleet may are in disrepair and must not air-conditioned. The report recommends replacing the current fleet of 59 buses with air-conditioned, reasonably comfortable shuttles.

The task force also would make the bus system more practical, dependable and efficient. mately, the task force hopes taking the bus to school will be more appealing option to off-campus students than hunting for parking.

To allow the unimpeded movement of buses around campus, report suggests reopening the Pond pass-through to transit bicycles and closing Ross Street to private vehicles during the day.

Also recommended are routes more often, providing tended bus service during evenings and weekends, providing selected off-campus sites — such shopping areas and theaters — on-campus residents, and bus shelters at all major stops.

Once current parking solutions, such as the construction of the West Campus parking garage are completed, the task force "strongly recommends" that additional spaces not be built.

To help pay for the recommended project, the report suggests instituting a mandatory campus activity fee for students, with an additional parking option for an additional fee. The department is in the process of purchasing 23 new buses, Williams said.
