

**A&M water samples test negative for bacteria**

Texas A&M failed to collect the required amount of bacteriological samples from the system's water sources in March 2000. The monthly monitoring is required by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission's Drinking Water Standards and Safe Drinking Water Act.

The commission requires the A&M collect 60 samples each month to test the chlorine levels in the drinking water, said Nathan Jones, safety and environmental compliance manager with the Physical Plant.

"The chlorine tests see if there is a potential in the water for bacterial growth, which would then be harmful to people's health," Jones said.

A positive test would indicate the presence of chlorine, but Jones said that a positive result rarely happens.

"If we do get a positive test, it is usually due to a sampling error or problem with the [testing] jar," he said. "But then we will retest and there is usually not a problem."

A&M collected 46 samples in March, failing to meet the 60-sample requirement due to a high level of rainfall and windy conditions that month.

"It is not our protocol to go outside and pool samples," Jones said. "We don't want to be an interference to the residents. So we do our sampling outside. Because of this, the weather can delay us. Plus, when a sample is taken, it has to be turned [within] 24 hours, so sampling cannot be done over the weekend."

Even though the requirements for the number of samples was not met, Jones said the 46 test results were
