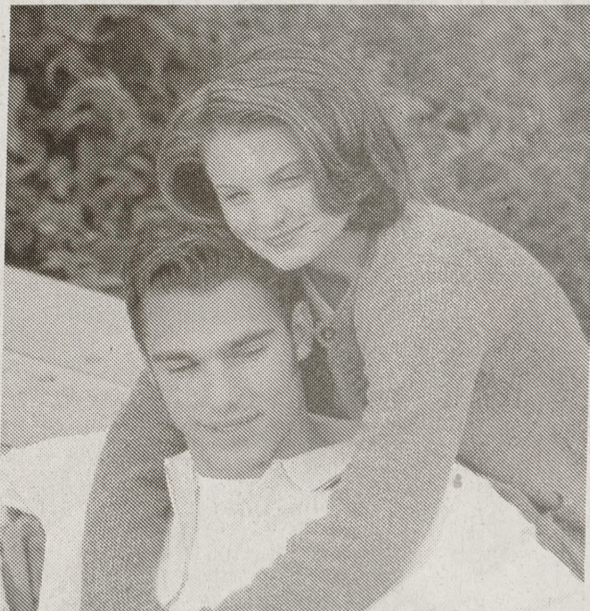

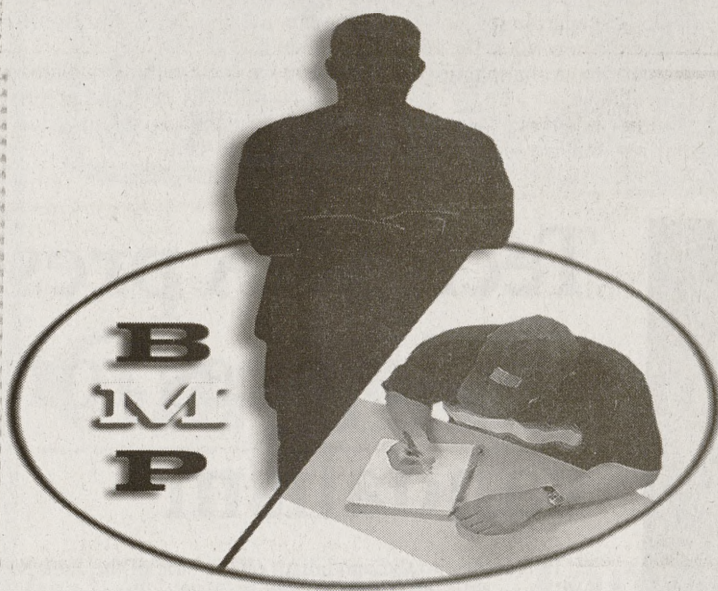

News in Brief
Two arrested in firearm/drug raid

Christina Shockey, 18, and John Weller, 22, were arrested at their apartment at 3031 Texas Avenue, #12, when officers responded to a report of a disturbance involving firearms.

College Station Police Department officers were arriving on scene as a maroon Chevrolet S10 pickup was leaving, according to a CSPD release.

The officers stopped and searched the pickup, finding a .38 S&W mm pistol, 3/4 of a pound of marijuana and 23 units of what the thought was MDMA (ecstasy).

Shockey and Weller were charged with possession of a controlled substance and unlawfully carrying a weapon. Weller was also arrested on an outstanding warrant for failure to serve jail time on a criminal trespass charge.

CSPD later received a call indicating that three people were in the area. The officers searched the apartment before police got there. The CSPD released those people allegedly took an undetermined amount of cash before fleeing in a van.
