

**Man throws son out of window**

NEW YORK (AP) — A man threw his 3-month-old son out a 15th-floor window minutes after his estranged wife called police to say he had violated an order of protection, authorities said.

The couple had been arguing over a visitation schedule regarding their infant when the woman made the call early Tuesday morning, police said.

A responding police officer saw the baby's body lying on a grassy area and summoned an ambulance with water and groped them on June 11.

In exchange for the guilty plea, a judge agreed to sentence Nunez to six months in jail, a 1/2 years probation and 250 hours of community service.

Derek Slade, 30, was arrested at the home. Later Tuesday, he was pronounced dead at the scene.
