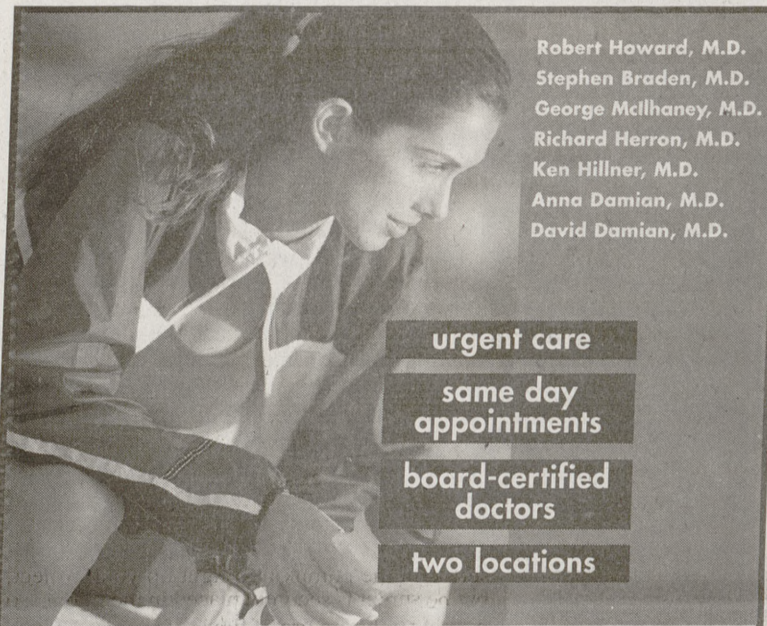

Doyle. "But more, this law in ways is leaving many Americans believe that the drunk driving problem has been addressed and could be further from the truth."

Arguing for the law, MADD, a 170-pound man would have four drinks in one hour on an empty stomach, and a 137-pound man would have three drinks in one hour, for a 0.08. Both MADD and the American Beverage Institute cited National Highway Traffic Safety Administration studies (NHTSA).

MADD also said that alcohol is just as intoxicating in beer, hard liquor. It said a 12-ounce beer, a five-ounce glass of wine, a 12-ounce wine cooler all contain the same amount of alcohol and the same intoxicating potential of 1/2 ounces of hard liquor.

NHTSA cautioned that alcohol, such as sleep and food consumption could affect blood alcohol level. Clinton called efforts to pass a national drunken-driving standard uphill battle. It was approved by the House and 78-10 by the Senate. The provision was part of a billion transportation spending bill loaded with pre-election high-profile mass transit and aviation projects every state.

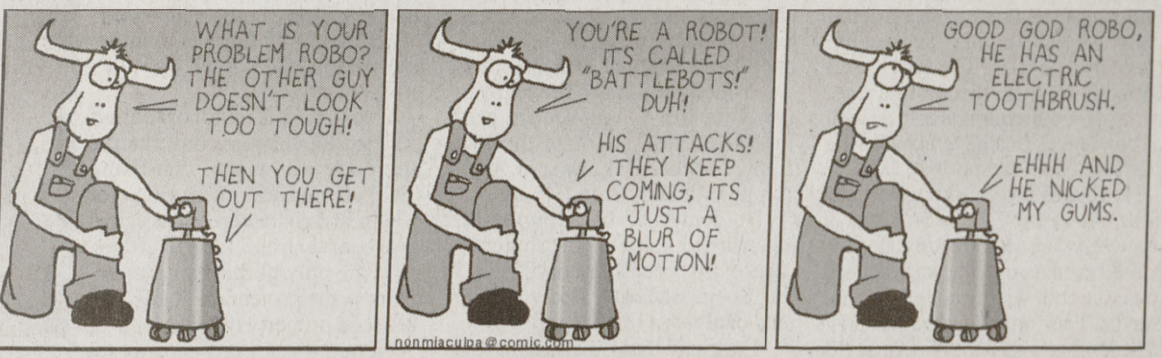
To accommodate them, the bill sure was \$7.3 billion higher than last year's level. \$3.3 billion more than Clinton requested and nearly \$1 billion larger than earlier versions passed by the House and Senate.

"We can't veto every bill because there is pork in it," said president spokesman Jake Siewert.

Clinton said alcohol is the greatest factor in motor vehicle deaths and injuries.

"Lowering the limit will make responsible Americans take a greater care when they drink alcohol in any amounts, if they intend to drive," he said.
