A&M education department officials said they strongly support theory work in the classroom and student teaching the final semester of a students' senior year. The department is one of the top in the nation for teacher-retention rate, Carr said. In the first year after graduation, 96 to 100 percent of A&M graduates remain teachers. For the second year, about 93 percent remain working as teachers, compared to the national average of about 30 percent.

"After the first year, it is harder to keep teachers in the field due to low pay and long hours," said Dr. Becky Carr, assistant dean of academic affairs for the education department. "A&M has been pretty successful in keeping its graduates in the teaching profession.

The curriculum at A&M is specialized, depending on what field students want to go into within the teaching profession. Classes range from psychology courses dealing with the educational development of children to the socio-economic backgrounds of the state in which students plan to teach. Many of the classes involve a great amount of theory work, compared to the Teach for America program, which encourages more hands-on training and less theory work, program officials said.

"Students interested in the Teach for America program need to be resourceful, intelligent, creative and have a desire to improve public education," Stauffer said.
