To help compensate for grades, athletes are offered additional resources to help them succeed, said Wally Groff, director of the Athletic Department.

The department employs six time academic advisers and 11 graduate assistants to monitor athletes' academic progress.

Groff said that low graduation rates, especially in football, are partly the result of athletes leaving college sports professionally.

"College is supposed to be a place where you look at Aaron Glenn, he left with the New York Jets, and he's making \$3 million. I don't see anything wrong with that."

Groff pointed out that improvement in graduation rates has improved over the last few years and that academics are considered when recruiting athletes.

Despite recent improvements, Childs said, the demands of sports competition create a situation

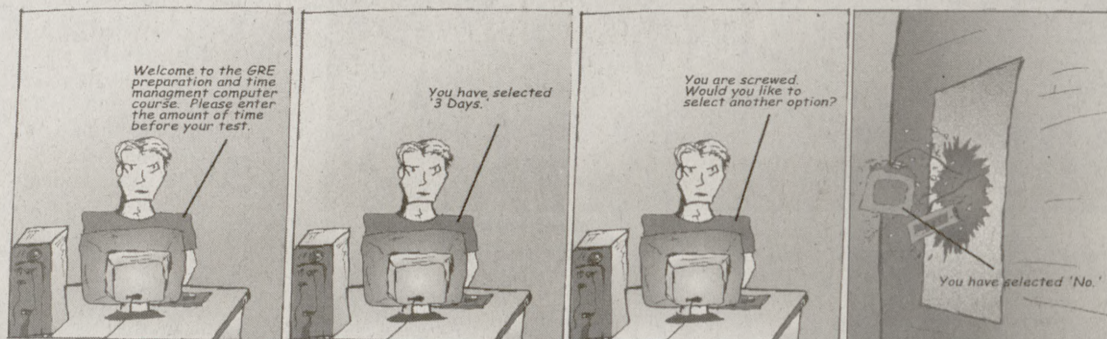

3. You must have a cumulative 2.0 GPR at Texas A&M University.
4. You must be in good standing with the University. (No outstanding parking tickets, blocks, etc.)

GRADUATE STUDENT REQUIREMENTS**

1. Your degree must be conferred and posted on SIMS or if you have completed all degree requirements, you may present an original letter of completion from the Office of Graduate Studies.
2. You must be in good standing with the University. (No outstanding parking tickets, blocks, etc.)

PROCEDURE TO ORDER RING

If you met all of the above requirements and you wish to receive your ring on Dec. 7th, visit the Ring Office no later than Oct. 26th between 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. to complete the application for eligibility verification.

Return no later than Oct. 27th, 8:30-3:30 p.m. to check the status of your order and if qualified, pay full in cash, check, money order, or your personal Discover, Visa, or Mastercard (with your name imprinted).
