## News in Brief

### Car, RV collide, 5 killed, 2 injured

MUSTANG RIDGE, Texas (AP) — Two children and their grandfather were among five people killed Saturday when their recreational vehicle was struck head-on by a car near Austin.

Lillian Kateri Avila, 3, and Carmen Celene Avila, 2, died along with their grandfather, 59-year-old Gary Brinkley, Department of Public Safety spokeswoman Tela Mange said. All three were residents of Cameron.

Mange said Brinkley was driving the RV when a Lincoln Continental veered into oncoming westbound lanes and collided with the RV.

Two occupants of the Lincoln, Don Walton, 76, and his wife, Beth Winkler Walton, 79, of San Antonio, also died in the wreck, Mange said.

Mange said the Lincoln spun around and came to rest in the eastbound lanes, and the motor home turned on its right side and burst into flames.

Two other occupants of the RV were injured.

### Trench collapse kills two workers

RICHMOND, Texas (AP) — Two construction workers were killed Saturday evening after the trench they were working in collapsed and buried them under a 14-foot pile of dirt.

A third unidentified worker was pulled from the ditch about seven hours after the collapse when rescue crews digging through the rubble heard his pleas for help and found his head protruding from the soil, Richmond Police Capt. George Peru said.

The two other bodies were located a few hours later.

The accident occurred about 10:30 a.m. at a construction site for a Home Depot hardware store, Peru said. He said the trench — about 16 feet deep and about 10 feet wide — was braced to prevent such a collapse.

## USS Cole begins journey home

ADEN, Yemen (AP) — Sailors aboard the USS Cole stood at attention as the national anthem played and the battered destroyer glided out of Aden port Sunday, towed by tugboats to a Norwegian heavy-lift ship that will take it home to repair the gaping hole in its side.

For the sailors, the departure meant leaving behind the harbor where 17 shipmates were killed and 39 were injured on Oct. 12 in what officials believe was a suicide bombing attack.

"She left with some help from her friends, but she still left very proudly," Barbara Bodine, the U.S. ambassador to Yemen, said of the Cole.

The destroyer's journey began at 9:20 a.m. local time as the American flag was hoisted on a mast to a hearty cheer from the sailors. Two yellow tugboats steadily and slowly pulled

the destroyer out to sea while two more pushed. Two U.S. patrol boats

led the procession, and a helicopter made flying runs overhead. The trip back to the United States is expected to take about five weeks. As the Cole left the harbor, it

passed a cluster of buildings where the two suspects in the bombing are believed to have lived as they planned the attack. Visible from shore was a 40-foot-by-40-foot blackened hole blasted into the ship's left side. Officials believe the bombers, who have not yet been positively identified, maneuvered a small boat packed with explosives next to the Cole and detonated it.

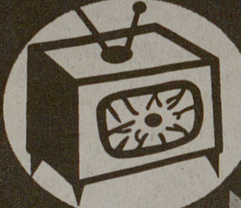
The departure of the Cole is a relief for ordinary Yemenis. There has been widespread anger at the United States here for what many Yemenis believe is U.S. bias toward Israel in its confrontations with the Palestinians. Also, tight security in the harbor had made it difficult for Yemeni fishermen to work in the weeks since the bombing.
