Baker served as secretary of state from January 1989 to August 1992. During this time and as the United States entered the post-Cold War era, Baker traveled to more than 90 foreign countries, brokered major deals on reducing conventional and strategic arms, provided U.S. support for Germany's reunification and convened a Middle East peace conference that has been the foundation of modern peace efforts.

A Houston native, Baker graduated from Princeton University in 1952, served two years in the United States Marine Corps and received his juris doctor with honors from the University of Texas-Austin School of Law in 1957. Baker has served in senior government positions under three U.S. presidents and led presidential campaigns for five consecutive presidential elections from 1976 to 1992.

Presently, he is a senior partner in the law firm of Baker Botts and senior counselor to the Carlyle Group, a merchant banking firm in Wash-

ington, D.C "I am not being romantic about this, my friends; we do have corruption in American government," Baker said. "We did throughout our history, and we are going to have it tomorrow and the next day and the next year. What I am suggesting, however, is that we are really better off than we sometimes think.
