said he does not support prohibiting smoking.

"I am a nonsmoker and I think we have the right to go to a public restaurant and ask for nothing agreeable to happen," Greer said.

Greer said smokers have the right to smoke in public if they want, if others do not approve of it.

Coate said the ordinance is about rights.

"This is not a human rights issue, this is a public health issue being discussed," Coate said.

David Posadas, owner of Z restaurant in Bryan, said his restaurant supports the revisions and has implemented its own policy.

"Sunday has been designated as smoking hours at our restaurant, our business has not suffered, in fact, it is better; customers love us," Posadas said. "We are not installing smoking rooms — we are installing food."

However, other B-CS restaurant owners voiced opposition to the proposed changes.

"If it is a public health issue, hasn't the state health board done something?" said Bob Brown of the restaurant.

Brown added that prohibiting smoking in restaurants would be for his business.

"The economics of this could be devastating to my business," Brown said.

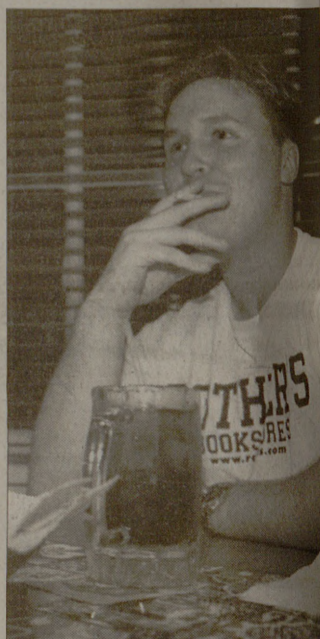
Brown's feelings were echoed by other restaurant owners.

Paul McNamara, beverage and hospitality manager for Red Lobster, said changing the ordinance would affect his restaurant's operations.

"It's hard to compete in our industry. A smoking ban will impact sales," McNamara said.

The city councils have not made a decision about revising the ordinance.

The councils will separately review the ordinance.
