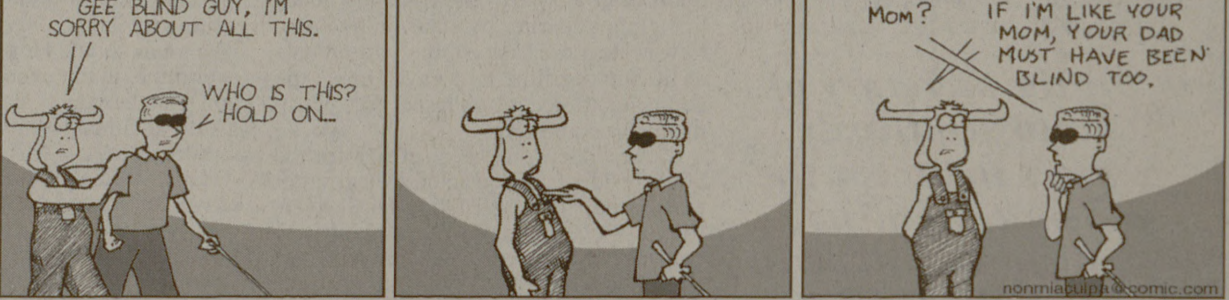

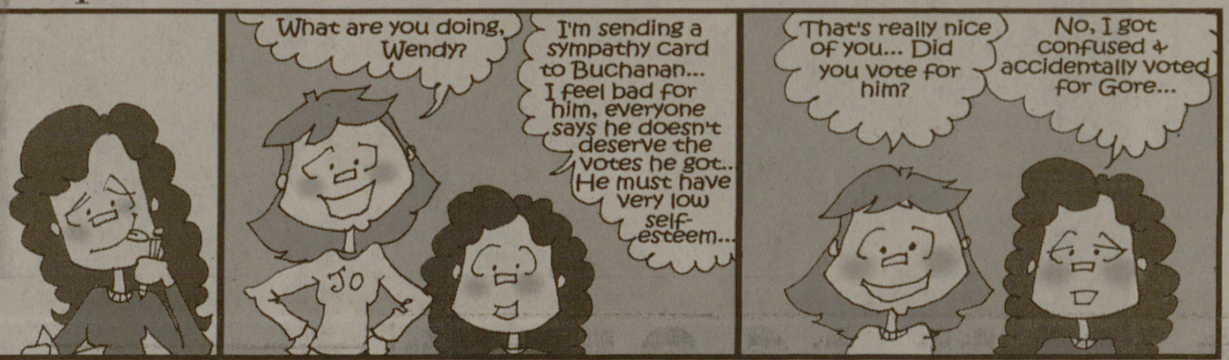

Aggies Alpha Phi Omega, Association of Former Students and Aggie former student joined together to form the "We wanted to do this to our support for the families the victims," said Scott Blackwell, chairman of EveryBleeds Maroon and a senior electrical engineering major. "More importantly, we want to give back to the people of Texas. There is a shortage of blood now. When we needed it a ago, all of Texas was here to port us, so we want to do something for them."

More blood-donation sites being added every day as Aggie former student clubs coordinate blood-donation centers in communities.

Lt. Gov. Rick Perry donated blood Tuesday in Austin as part of the program.

Texas A&M Galveston, West Texas A&M are also participating in the program.

The organizers' goal is to collect 12,000 units of blood. Each person donates one unit.

"We would like to shatter that goal by quite a bit," Blackwell said. "We would like to show families and everyone else what Aggies did in remembrance of those who died."

Blackwell said the Red Cross said the program has been very well.

"Texas is the greatest state in the land," Blackwell said.

The Gulf Coast Regional Blood Center will open all eight of its facilities in the Houston-Galveston area from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday. Donors should know they are donating blood as part of EveryOne Bleeds Maroon.

The Dallas-Fort Worth area will have 12 centers open Saturday.

Blackwell said organizers are hoping to make the event bigger next year and to make it a nationwide effort.

"We want this to be something like Muster — a memorial event but for the fall semester," Blackwell said.

On-campus blood-donation centers will be open the entire week at Rudder Fountain, Duncan Dining Center, Commons Lobby, Zachry Building, Veterinary Medical Science Building, Biology Building and the Stadium Recreation Center.
