News in Brief

Absentee ballots thrown out in Fla.
TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — A Republican governor said Saturday that George W. Bush's margin among voters who sent ballots from overseas should have been larger than reported, saying the GOP is considering a lawsuit because large numbers of absentee ballots were thrown out.

While gaining 1,380 votes to Al Gore's 750 from the overseas absentees, the Bush campaign complained about large numbers of ballots that were thrown out, often for a lack of an overseas postmark.


Montana Gov. Marc Racicot, appearing at a news conference that Republicans held in Austin, told reporters that "the vice president's lawyers have gone to war in my judgment against the men and women who serve in our Armed Forces."

Racicot said Bush's lawyers could still file a legal challenge to the rejected military ballots. "We are presently in the process of examining our remedies," he said. "... We haven't made our final judgment."

"Each of the victims' families... an area reserved in the outer perimeter. Texas A&M President Ray M. Bowen said the ceremony was special for the families who have gone through the most difficult of the opportunity to participate in this event and reflect back on the events of the past year," he said.

All but two of the families present for the remembrance ceremony. The families of Christopher Lee Breen and Christopher Lee Breen attended other events in the towns, but close friends and their representatives.

John McBride, a freshman medical science major, and he represented the Heard family. McBride was Heard's roommate at the Marine Military Academy. He came to A&M as the recipient of The Christopher Lee Memorial Scholarship. McBride he was "proud to take part in the ceremony."

He said his friend was in mind as he walked toward the bonfire to light a candle.


"I was thinking: It was a long ago that this is where the McBride said. "It helped me think of all of those people. [The ceremony] brought a sense of closure," he said.
