"Students are not willing to chance that being late will get them in any way," said Walker, UT admissions director. Walker told the *Austin Statesman* that his office has aged high school counselors to press students to apply the December break.

So far, 4,963 students applied for the fall, compared to 3,502 at the same time last year.

"The earlier the student application in, the longer we work with the student to make that the file is complete," Walker said. "Generally, there are items they go through this process once in life, and they get it wrong."

Although UT does not have acceptance, A&M does.

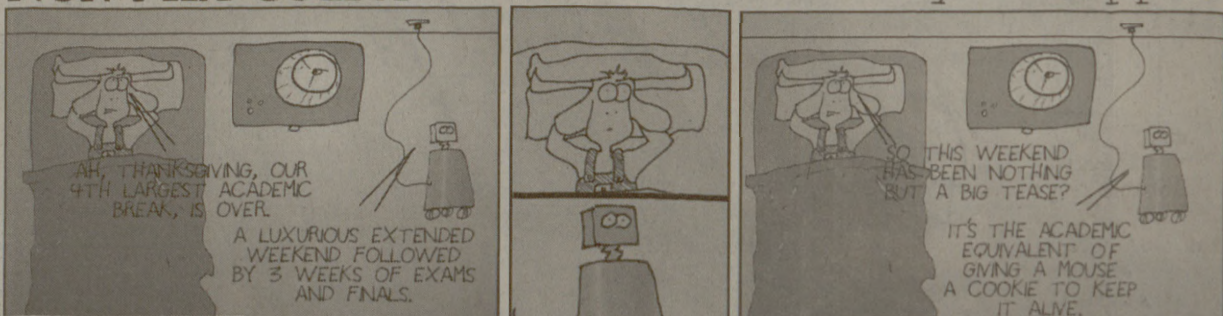
Joseph Estrada, assistant director for enrollment, said A&M's office may be why the campus ready received 8,110 applications before Thanksgiving.

His office asked admissions officials can begin view the first week in January and those admitted early certified in January.

Early admissions will be those in the top 10 percent of students in the top half of the SAT or at least 30 on the ACT.

"The earlier we get word from students, the better they are at a good selection," Estrada said. "We know that applicants are a multitude of other universities sometimes will take the offer as the institution of choice."

"We have no assurance that the other side will stop," he said.

Anticipating the certification, Gore was preparing a speech to be delivered today, explaining his case for the continuing challenge.

Gore, who got 337,183 more votes than Bush nationwide on Nov. 7, said he has an obligation to the people who supported him and Lieberman, more than for any Democratic ticket before them.

In an interview with *The New York Times*, he said, "every vote that is legally cast must be fairly and accurately counted in accordance with the law."

"If at the end of this process ... Governor Bush is successful, I will spare no effort to help him unify the country behind his leadership," Gore said. "And I would expect him to do the same if I am successful."

Sen. Trent Lott, the Republican leader, called on Gore "to end his campaign and concede this election with the honor and dignity the American people expect."

Sen. Tom Daschle, the Democratic leader, said that was not going to happen.

"I've talked with most of my colleagues the last several days and there isn't any conceding anything at this point."

The votes were delivered to Harris in a 5 p.m. EST deadline set by the state Supreme Court, which allowed hand recounts through day, 12 days past the date she had said the election should be final.

Palm Beach County halted its marathon to file partial results with the state in time deadline and reported a net gain of 180 votes for Gore — with an unknown number to count deadline.
