the audience. "You may face prejudice, but you have to forgive people for their ignorance."

Participants in the audience spoke on indirect attacks of racism, such as messages on bathroom stalls and Confederate flags on the bumpers of many Aggie vehicles.

James encouraged students to use such opportunities to educate their peers.

"Sometimes we can be ignorant, too," James said. "We may very well be their first cultural experience. Don't be the ignorant black person."

"The majority of problems that I hear aren't academic, but in how people handle their relationships," said Regan Miller, a senior biomedical science major.

Despite the present condition,

A&M's Vision 2020 plan calls for increased diversification and globalization of the student body.

"Texas A&M University must attract and nurture a more ethnically, culturally and geographically diverse faculty, staff and student body," according to the plans' goal for diversity.

Barry Hammond, a sophomore finance major, told the audience how leaders need to define and represent their actions and beliefs.

"Because there are so few of us, you must excel in everything you do," Hammond said. "You can't change the situation, but you can change the outcome. You must represent your culture well every single day. You must have strong communication skills or your message is lost."

April Young, a junior journalism major, stressed the need to build cohesion among the African-American students on campus.

"I fear that five years from now, blacks will be extinct on our campus," Young said. "Don't give up on A&M. Bad-mouthing the school to friends and family won't help increase our black enrollment rates."

Young encouraged freshmen to get involved on campus and help minority recruitment efforts by sharing their experiences with high school students.

are that the ordinance may be confusing for business, social event organizers, and a time for downtown patrons come familiar with the ordinance.

The city will use mass outlets to inform the public of the ordinance.

"We are going to use newspapers such as The [Bryan College Station] Eagle, and television audiences," Cosentino said. "I think appropriate notices also be posted throughout the town area, notifying individual public consumption is prohibited."

Violators can be charged with Class C misdemeanor and fined.

"The city of Bryan is addressing a problem that has just recently and this is one attempt to solve it," said Cosentino.
