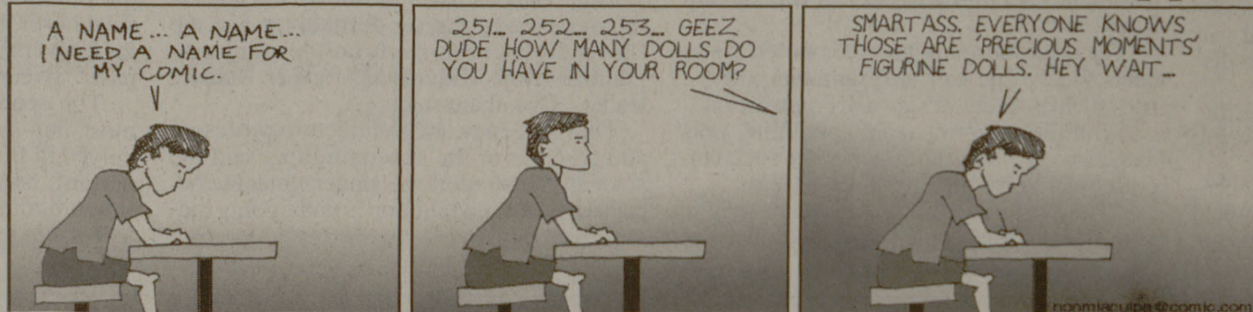

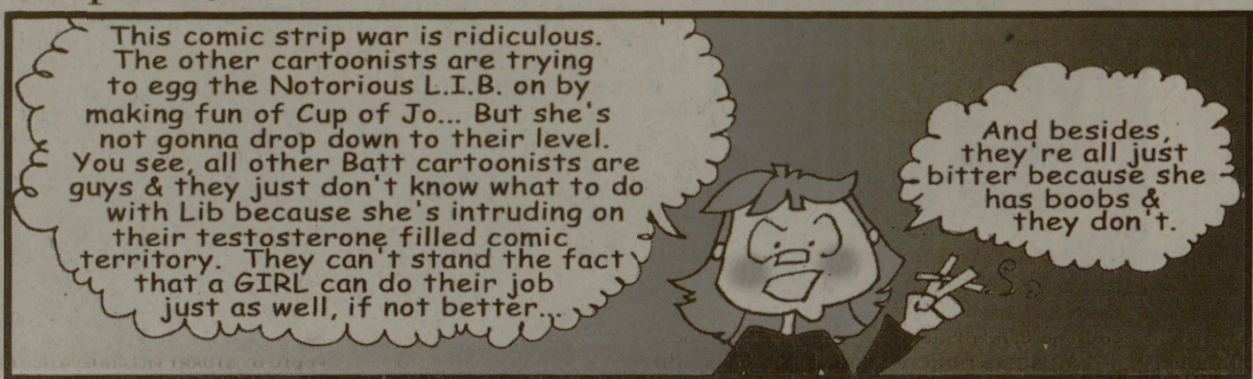

is convinced lawmakers need to go into special session as early as next week to name its own slate of presidential electors. And Senate President John McKay agreed that was a "reasonable conclusion."

Florida Gov. Jeb Bush, the candidate's brother, said he would sign the necessary legislation "if it was the appropriate thing to do."

Still, with the recount case headed to the highest court in the land, Jeb Bush said, "The United States Supreme Court trumps the Legislature." Gore himself told CNN that Florida voters would not stand for "the expression of their will taken away by politicians."

Gore is trying to overturn official results of the decisive Florida election before the public's patience runs out on the 22-day ordeal. "I certainly believe that I did" win the White House, Gore told NBC.

Needing a quick court victory, Gore authorized his divided legal team to ask the Florida Supreme Court to recount contested ballots or order a lower court to do it, two Democratic legal sources said late Wednesday.

Bush school chair named

The Bush School of Government and Public Service executive associate professor Robert M. Vedlitz became the first Bob Bullock Chair in Government and Public Policy Wednesday.

The faculty chair, a former lieutenant governor, is one of two chairs created as a gift from the Bullock Foundation. The \$1 million endowment was presented by Bullock's widow, Terim Dean Robert M. Vedlitz said the new position was a great accomplishment for him and the Bush School, forming a "truly a tremendous honor." "This is truly a tremendous honor," Vedlitz said. "I am the local ally proud and proud of the Mark School for this chair's background to be associated with the band and legacy of a man whose State legacy figure in our history."

As holder of the endowed position will serve as director of the new Institute for Science, Technology and Public Policy.

The institute is expected to promote research that will make public officials with more informed decisions regarding technology and public policy.

"It seems especially fitting, and one of the two chairs, the School endowed by Mrs. Smith dedicated to promoting the school to come, our effort to create a worthy goal: better decisions for the lives for all Americans," Vedlitz said.

Bullock served as lieutenant governor from 1991 to 1995.

the friendships you build in the process of building it."

Sweeney said the committee must find a way to maximize student participation in the event, which will no longer be a professional engineering event.
