News in Brief

Promenade lot changes complete

The latest change to the Northgate parking situation has been completed. Individual parking meters have been installed in each of the spaces in the Northgate Promenade parking lot. Previously, the entire lot was serviced by one device that distributed permits for drivers to display in their vehicle. Patrons are allowed one hour of free parking during the hours of 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Each additional hour will cost 50 cents. Evening parking from 6 p.m. to 2 a.m. will cost \$1 per hour.

The parking meters accept quarters and all types of dollar coins. Under College Station city ordinance, all on-street public parking is controlled by the fire department. Bob Humphreys, public information officer for the College Station Fire Department, said the next step is to implement a token and pre-payment card program for the new meters. Humphreys says the token and card options should be in place by this summer.

Senate to vote on student services fee bill

The Records Management Fee that was to be considered by the Board of Regents in March meeting was not approved for the meetings agenda by the Texas A&M Provost. The Student Senate will meet Wednesday in Koldus 144 at 7:30 p.m. The Student Services Fee Bill will be voted during the meeting. The calls for different allocation of the Students Services Fee to the Texas Legislature proves the Student Recreation Center to have its own fee.
