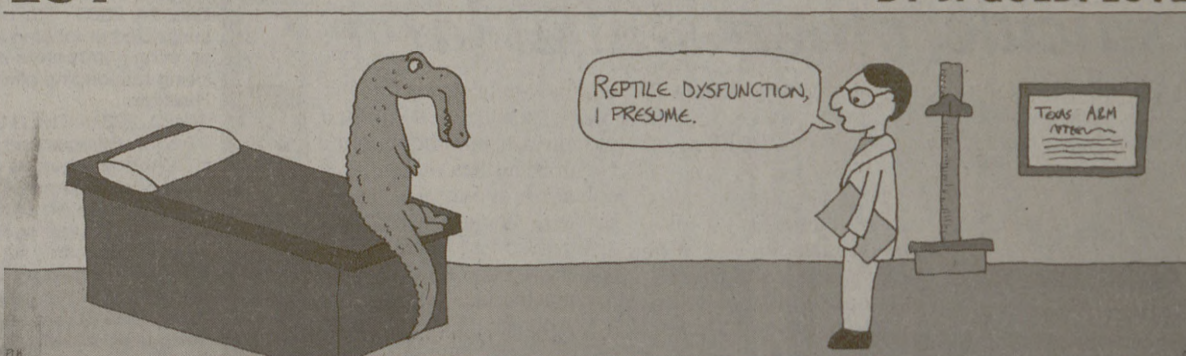

News in Brief
Drive underway to collect blood for former prof

Sixty pints of blood were collected Monday in a scholarship blood drive held for Laura Kitzmiller, former A&M assistant professor of health and kinesiology.

Theresa Evangelista, territory manager for the American Red Cross of College Station, said the Red Cross was contacted early December and asked to hold a drive in Kitzmiller's name.

Red Cross officials said the blood drive will benefit Kitzmiller and that she suffers from an illness, the name of which has not been released.

"Everyone kept asking what they could do to help out," said Dr. Paula Miller, visiting assistant professor of health and kinesiology. "We felt that this was a way that the staff and students could help [Kitzmiller] while at the same time helping with the blood shortage."

Kitzmiller served on the faculty for more than 25 years and retired recently due to illness.

"She started the emergency medical training (EMT) program here at A&M and taught the first aid course for a number of years," Miller said.

Because of the large turnout, the blood drive has been extended throughout today from a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Reed Building.

Ferguson, Student Government association vice president for political science and a senior political science major.

Another change requires undergraduate students who wish to enroll in graduate courses to have a cumulative grade point ratio (GPR) of 3.0 or the approval of his academic dean. Before, the GPR requirement was not cumulative.

Additions to the rules concern student conduct proceedings. The way records of the proceedings are kept, ensuring they are non-streuous and sensitive to the victim and the accuser, said Jacquie Varg, assistant to the dean of student life.
