the highest grades. The IFC has begun giving a percent discount on the following semester's dues for fraternities that posted grades above the national average. Meg Manning, a member of the Panhellenic Council, said all sororities are committed to academic excellence. Panhellenic sororities reported a 2.892 GPR for Fall 2000. The three sororities with the highest GPR are Kappa Alpha Theta, Omega and Delta Delta Delta. Manning said the sororities were founded on the value of scholarship and seek pledges who have a commitment to academics and leadership. The Panhellenic Council has established a system of rewards for members who show commitment to their academics. These incentives range from a one-time \$150 scholarship to congratulating members who earn a 4.0 GPR by listing their names in a *Battalion* advertisement. The Smartie Pants Award, one of the strongest incentives and coveted awards, is a plaque given to a sorority member who has a strong commitment to academic excellence and service to A&M. The co-ed Multicultural Greek Council represents 10 fraternities and sororities that are culturally based. Five of the chapters currently have a cumulative GPR higher than 2.7. The group with the highest GPR is Sigma Lambda Gamma. The Pan-Hellenic Council, historically comprised of African-American Greek groups, is home to several organizations, three of which have GPRs above 2.5. The group with the highest GPR is Zeta Phi Beta. To help Greeks realize their academic goals at A&M, there are multiple resources available that include private tutors, scholarships, management sessions and faculty and staff advisers. The combined GPR for the Corps of Cadets last semester was 2.69. The GPR for the freshmen in the Corps was slightly lower, at 2.61.
