The tradition of "passing down the pot" can no longer be used to determine future leadership, said Dr. Bryan Cole, Steering Committee facilitator and assistant vice president for quality leadership.

As a result, members are balancing needs for new forms of leadership with keeping the positive aspects of past leadership to formulate structures, Kaylor said.

After meeting with groups of former Bonfire workers, former student members and members of the student body in Fall 2000, the task force took its first step to identify the facets of Bonfire leadership that will remain in the revamped structure.

"We're trying to maximize the opportunities students will have in '02," Kaylor said. "We need to keep the intrinsic values of Bonfire — the hard work, camaraderie, the challenge that brought us all together — but we also have to include leadership opportunities for students who are not working on committees are the focus of Bonfire."

The Student Leadership and Participation Task Force will set up the structure of leadership and determine the method for choosing new leaders each year.

Members are working to have a plan by this fall. Co-chaired by junior agricultural development major Josh Kaylor, who is also president of the Resident Hall Association, and associate professor Don Sweeney, the leadership committee will present model structures to students for feedback in March before making any final decisions.

The report of the Special Commission on the 1999 Aggie Bonfire Leadership Task Force, designed to find new opportunities for leadership throughout the University, will pass through the University's administrative oversight.
