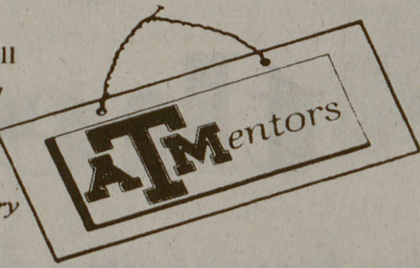

Kissinger, 2welvelead to play Bryan venue tonight

Bryan-College Station hosted Kissinger and 2welvelead together when they competed in 3rd Floor Cantina's Battle of the Bands.

A battle of the bands this is not, but Saturday's show should be as powerful and loud as the two bands were two months ago.

Kissinger will team up with 2welvelead again this Saturday night at 3rd Floor to refuel before its tour in April.

With the release of their new album *Charm*, Kissinger's present success comes as somewhat of a surprise to lead singer Choppper (pronounced Chaw-purr).

"I didn't think it would take off that fast," Choppper said about the CD that took two-and-a-half-years to make.

Produced by John Croslin, *Charm* took 30 months to record because the band used the studio when it was empty, so they could record for free.

Since good things finally have come those who waited, Kissinger is taking full advantage of the album's present popularity.

Their tour begins in April with shows in Dallas, Houston and

Austin, their hometown.

Choppper said goals for the band are still evolving.

"We're looking to get a bigger label," Choppper said. "We've already had to press our second thousand [CDs]."

In addition to recording the CD on their own, the band is self-managed and arranges tour dates and distribution of their album.

Kissinger is targeting the East Coast for its nationwide tour because

of the connections Choppper had during his stint with Vertical Horizon (VH).

As VH's original bass player, Choppper left when the band signed with RCA in 1997 to do Kissinger.

Choppper brought in old school bassist Otto Von Foxrock III and began hearing with him before the band's bassist Lucky and guitarist Garvey into the mix. The quantity

3000 Miles to Graceland

Starring Kurt Russell and Kevin Costner

3000 Miles to Graceland is a hip, edgy action movie filled with sharp characters and a superbly subtle story. Exciting and action-packed, it is difficult to imagine any other movie this year being cooler.

Michael (Russell) and Murphy (Costner) are ex-cons determined to make one last big score. What better place to rob than a Las Vegas casino during International Elvis week?

The robbery goes awry in stylish fashion with bodies and bullets flying everywhere in slow motion. These John Woo action sequences have become the industry standard for action movies, but *Graceland* still manages to make them seem fresh and fun.

After Michael and Murphy make their escape, the

real sparks begin to fly as a series of double-crosses between a young woman (Courteney Cox-quette), her son and \$3 million.

This movie is a glimpse into the future of film. Tightly edited and filmed with a highly energetic, reminiscent of music videos, *Graceland* also shows an amazing cast of richly drawn characters and a story that is more of a throwback to old classic films like *The Wild Bunch* and *The French Connection*.

This successful marriage between the modern and classic filmmaking style and older sensibilities regarding great characters and story means films can be made that appeal to the masses, giving them enough eye candy to keep them interested, while still appealing to those who long for depth in film.

Graceland is both an insightful look at loyalty and honor and a madcap road movie filled with wild, active scenes and amazing visuals.

Russell and Costner bring their characters to life with the greatest of ease. Their relationship is realized almost entirely through subtlety and small gestures. The scenes in which they go head-to-head crackle with great energy and offer the film's most enjoyable moments.

Cox-Arquette delivers her first good performance in a feature film. The cast is rounded out with a host of other talented actors including David Arquette, Kevin Pollack, Christian Slater, Howie Long and Ice-T.

This film is the most satisfying action thriller to be released in a long time. This film cannot be viewed as a thing but a success for all the talent involved, regardless of what critics and audiences may think, because any movie that walks the edge, the results are always worth it. (Grade: B+)

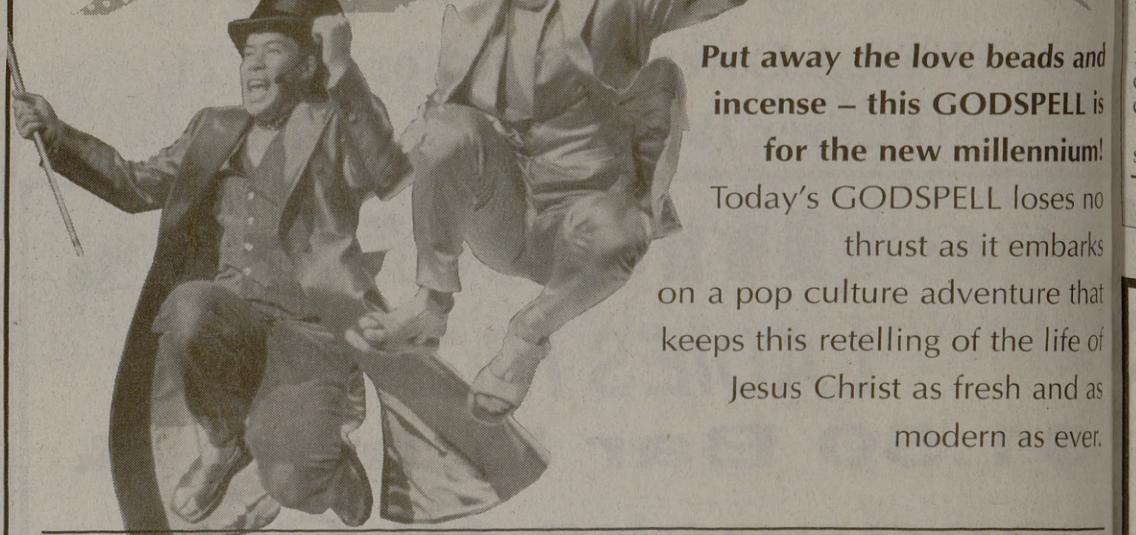
