Seton Hall asked to rescind one of its honorary degrees

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — A Roman Catholic group has asked Seton Hall University to rescind an honorary degree it awarded to a college president who served on a commission for an abortion rights group.

CatholicVote.org, a project of Catholic Alliance, said a Catholic school like Seton Hall should not recognize someone such as Dolores Cross, the head of Morris Brown College, who has a position contrary to church doctrine.

Cross was among 42 members of the National Commission on America Without Roe that was organized in 1992 by the

National Abortion Rights Action League, (NARAL) according to NARAL.

"We would strongly oppose the conferring of an honorary degree to a person who advocated racial profiling, was a member of the Ku Klux Klan or who was an anti-Semite," said Raymond Flynn, president of Catholic Alliance and former U.S. ambassador to the Vatican.

Cross said the alliance's request, made Tuesday, would "violate the spirit of the Constitution."

"At issue are the constitutional freedoms of speech and association," she said. "At-

tempts to associate my conduct with who act out of hatred is an affront to character and integrity."

Seton Hall, based in South Orange, N.J., Tuesday it was unaware of the request, said a spokesman.

Cross was awarded an honorary degree at Seton Hall's commencement ceremony on Tuesday for her extraordinary dedication to improving education for underserved students," Seton Hall spokesman said.

The Atlanta-based Morris Brown College has a predominantly black student body.

Crash kills a Navy pilot

FORT PIERCE, Fla. (AP) — A single-seat Navy jet fighter on a training mission crashed nose-first Tuesday on a ranch northeast of Lake Okechobee, killing the pilot, authorities said.

The St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office said witnesses saw a military aircraft go down about 10:30 a.m. on the V Bar 2 Ranch a few miles east of the Okechobee County line. No one ejected from the plane, witnesses said.

Sheriff Ken Mascara said a

sheriff's office helicopter conducted a search but called it off after a half hour because officials did not see any survivors or parachutes.

The pilot's identity was being withheld pending notification of his family members.

The F/A-18C Hornet took off from Oceana Naval Air Station in Virginia Beach, Va. It was on a routine training mission to Key West with 10 other Hornets from the air station when it crashed, the Navy said.

The remaining aircraft ar-

rived safely at Key West Naval Air Station, Oceana spokesman Mike Maus said.

Investigators have not determined the cause of the crash.

County Fire District spokesman Capt. Tom Whitley said witnesses reported seeing the aircraft "coming nose down from the sky."

Large pieces of wreckage lay in a crater 15 feet deep and 20 feet wide, Whitley said. Smaller pieces of the plane were scattered in a half-mile circle around the wreck.

News in Brief

Ship may remain in Pearl Harbor

PEARL HARBOR, Hawaii (AP) — The Navy reached a tentative deal with the nonprofit operator of the USS Missouri Memorial to keep the battleship at its current location in Pearl Harbor for at least three years.

The USS Missouri Memorial Association's lease for the pier F-5 at Ford Island set to expire July 31.

A Navy spokeswoman said the Navy recognizes the historical significance of the battleship on the deck of Japan's surrender to the United States in 1945.

The Missouri served in World War II, the Korean War and the Gulf War before its final Navy decommissioning in 1992.

Police: Man kills two for apartment

NEW YORK (AP) — A man was charged Monday with killing two people who could move into their apartments after authorities found him and a victim's severed head in one of the homes, police said.

Bernard Perez, 20, and another man, Rahman Williams, 21, were found at the victim's Manhattan apartment Monday. Both were charged with murdering the man whose head was found in the kitchen sink and whose body parts were scattered around the neighborhood, police said.

Perez was also charged with murdering Doris Dufford, 44, who lived in the same building as the other membered man in a different apartment. Her body was found last week in the Harlem River and police said she had been strangled.
