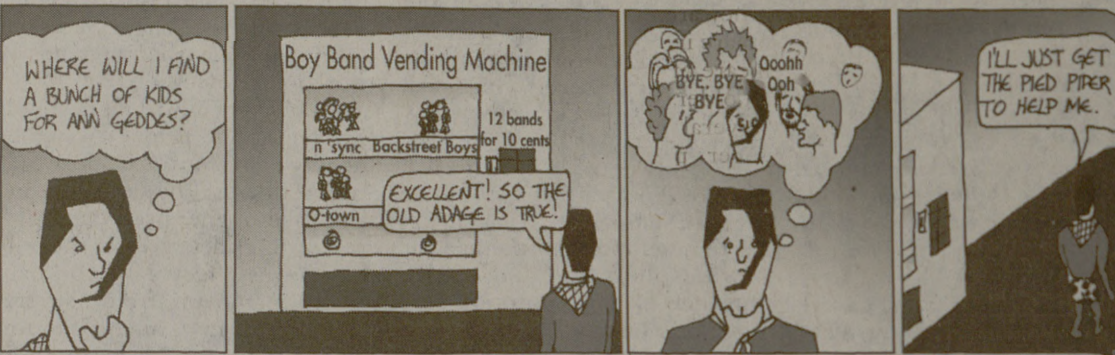

Mark Dore, a manager at the restaurant, referred all questions to the corporate headquarters, which did not return telephone calls seeking comment.

Jenna Bush's earlier no contest plea stemmed from a ticket police issued while checking for minors in possession of alcohol at nightclubs along the popular East Sixth Street entertainment district April 27.

She was ordered to pay

\$51.25 in court costs, serve eight hours of community service and attend six hours of alcohol awareness classes.

John Wall, who prosecuted that case, said if Jenna Bush is issued a ticket in this case, her punishment might be revoked and authorities might seek a conviction. She also could have her driver's license suspended, he said.

back this year, while single parents would receive up to \$500 and married couples up to \$600.

The refund checks come to 5 percent of a filer's first taxable income, based on last year's figures: the first \$6,000 for an individual filer and \$12,000 for a married couple. In the tax legislation, Congress lowered the bottom tax rate for 2001 to 10 percent from 15 percent.

"You only get a lot of people at night now because this is the type of place where a good majority of the customers were people who liked to come in, sit down, have a cup of coffee and smoke," he said. "Those who do come in during the day are usually pretty pissed about the ban, and pissed people don't leave good tips."

Amy Velasquez, a server member at Olive Garden, said the drop in day customers combined with the small summer population of College Station has made it extremely difficult to make a reasonable amount of money as a waiter/waitress.

"You really have to work a lot harder for less of a tip than you got before," she said.

But the smoking ban has affected all restaurants negatively.

Andy Closs, manager of Wings 'N More, said that while he does not agree with the ban, it has had little effect on his business because of an exemption that allows people to smoke on the back porch of the restaurant.

Barbara Hensley, manager of Denny's, said business has improved because of the number of people who are more likely to dine out because they no longer have to deal with the issue of other people's smoking.

"Even the smokers who were saying that they wouldn't be back ended up returning," she said. "They don't like [the ban] but they like to come here and eat out."

One such smoker is customer Robin Lampe, who says smoking after eating or while having coffee was something she had enjoyed for most of her life, but she still eats out because she does not enjoy cooking for herself.

"It is a change to the way that things have always been, and it takes away our rights as individuals," she said. "But eating out is something I enjoy, although a lot less now."
