Backstreet Boy A.J. checks into rehab

NEW YORK (AP) - A.J. McLean of the Backstreet Boys has entered rehabilitation for depression and alcohol abuse, forcing the group to postpone the rest of its U.S. and Canada tour dates.

The other four members of the boy band — Kevin Richardson, Howie Dorough, Nick Carter and Brian - made the announcement to MTV News on Monday during the video countdown show "Total Request Live.'

All four were choked up discussing the troubles of their 23-year-old bandmate, as were teen-age members of the live studio audience.

"When you're trying to help someone who has a serious illness, they have to help themselves first before they can really receive help. They've gotta really want it, said Littrell, 26.

"He came to us yesterday for the first time. I heard him say, 'Guys, I have a problem and I need to get help.' We figured this was the best for him. It's all about him being

healthy.' Richardson said McLean, a native of West Palm Beach, Fla., is entering rehab for 30 days for "depression, anxiety and his excessive consumption of alcohol." It is unknown where he will receive

treatment. "We didn't want to lie about it. We didn't want to push it under the rug," the 29-year-old Richardson said. "We want to be honest with our fans. He's getting help.

He's going to be better.' The recent death of McLean's grandmother has been a source of anxiety for him, but he was depressed even before that, Richardson

"He's been burning the candle at both ends and partying quite a bit to escape it," he said. "His alcoholism is — it's pretty bad. And we're worried about him."

Publicists for the group declined to provide further information about McLean.

Earlier Monday, the Backstreet Boys announced they were postponing remaining sold-out concerts at Boston's FleetCenter this week after Carter, 21, injured his hands on Saturday.

The group's tour was scheduled to end in Vancouver, British Columbia on Aug. 7. Now, the tour will resume on that date and end on Sept. 28 in Edmonton, Alberta.

Carter said McLean's illness does not mean the group is breaking up.

'I don't think there is an end to this group until one of us dies," he said.

City High, one of the newest hip-hop/R&B groups, was not only lucky enough to be produced by Wyclef Jean and his cousin Jerry Wonder, but also scored a hit with their first release "What would you do?"

keeps its groovy urban beats, but the lyrics become harsh and Some of the harshest, true-

to-life lyrics may be in "Sista," a song in which a young man confesses to a friend that he has gotten his friend's sister pregnant. newest and hottest export, has

"Sista" is followed by more reallife lyrics in "What Would You Do?" where a prostitute confesses that the only reason she sells her body is to feed her hungry son.

One would expect "City High Anthem" to be a song with the group praising their success but instead, listeners get the sad picture of attending a high school in which there are "more dropouts than signups at registration" and pregnancy is at an all-time high.

The album ends with listeners wondering, "Where did the cool hip hop beats go?" Regardless, City High is gifted and talented and probably will not be leaving the hip-hop scene anytime soon. (Grade B-)

Andreas Johnson, Sweden's

experienced international success with his first single, "Glorious," which has become a Top 10 hit in ten countries including the UK, France, Germany, Ireland and Sweden.



London's Express described "Glorious" as an "unforgettable three minutes and 29 seconds of gorgeous, soaring guitar pop that manages to be both uplifting and devastatingly sad at the same time."

Johnson wrote every song on the album and each one is great, except for the fact that they are all about a girl and all on the same album. If we were Swedish we probably would have guessed from the title of his album, Liebling which is Swedish for "Darling."

Listeners can hear sadness in every "coffeehouse rock-like" song and imagine each track to be accompanied by a video in which love-struck Johnson roams the gloomy streets of New York with a Starbucks' coffee in his hand.

In "Should Have Been Me," another song about a girl, Johnson unites his jazz influences, which he got from his parents, who were both jazz musicians, with keyboards and creates a great song.

Johnson picks up the pace with the next song, "Breathing," however, in the last songs of the album, he soon goes back to crooning and moaning over a girl who either has him totally 'Submerged" in love or begging her to return his feelings.

In "Please Do Me Right," Johnson sings alongside a grand piano and creates a beautiful ballad (about a girl).

Johnson has a strong, recognizable voice, great musical talent and a lot of potential, but it also seems as though Johnson has to work through his heartbreaks and his dependency on women before he can create another album. (Grade C-)
