Ag Football players named All-American by Football News

Senior center Seth McKinney and junior cornerback Sammy Davis were named preseason All-Americans by the Football News. McKinney was named to the first-team offense, while Davis was named to the second-team defensive squad.

McKinney, out of Austin's Westlake High School, was an All-Big 12 and third-team All-

American selection last year. He has played in each of the possible 38 Aggie games during his career.

McKinney is also a candidate for the 2001 Outland and Lombardi awards.

Davis, a product of Houston's Humble High School, led the 2000 Aggies with four interceptions and also made 38 tackles. He also recorded 10 passes broken up, while being hampered with an ankle injury for the second half of the season.

Davis was also a 2000 All-Big 12 selection.

Notre Dame, UT games' singles tickets sold out

The Texas A&M ticket office announced in a Saturday press release that single game ticket orders will be accepted starting Monday, July 16. Single tickets are not available

for the Notre Dame and games.

Tickets for the Sept. 1 game against McNeese are available for \$25.

The remaining three games — all Big 12 conference — are Oklahoma State (Oct. 22), Baylor (Oct. 6), and State (Oct. 27). Tickets for these games cost \$35.

The ticket office said that if any single tickets for the Notre Dame (Sept. 1) and Texas (Nov. 23) games become available, they will be open for orders starting on Sept. 3.
