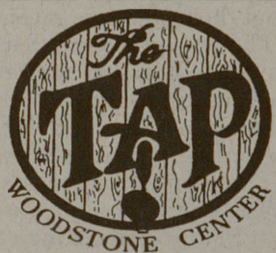

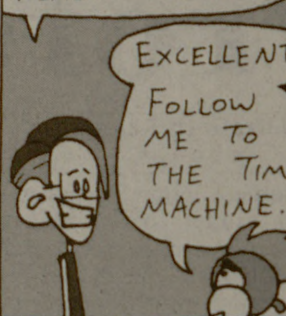

# Police suspect poison in death

ATLANTA (AP) — Authorities have reopened investigations into the deaths of a firefighter and a police officer who were romantically involved with the same woman.

The men died six years apart, and their deaths originally were attributed to irregular heartbeats.

The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) said Monday that Forsyth County firefighter Randy Thompson, who died Jan. 22 at age 32, was poisoned with ethylene glycol, a sweet, odorless chemical often found in antifreeze.

Authorities now are taking a fresh look at evidence in the autopsy of Cobb County police officer Maurice Glenn Turner, who died six years ago at age 31.

Turner's body was exhumed Monday from a Marietta cemetery for testing, which will take several weeks.

"I'm just glad to see it moving along finally," said his brother, James Turner. "I think there should have been an investiga-

tion done six years ago, and it wasn't. I just hope now it's not too late."

Glenn Turner and Thompson were romantically involved with Lynn Turner, a former 911 dispatcher with the Cobb police.

Lynn and Glenn Turner were married about six months before his death. Shortly after the death, Thompson moved in with her. The couple never married, but had two children before Thompson moved out in 1999.

Lynn Turner, 33, of Cumming declined to comment, *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution* reported Tuesday.

An autopsy on April 27 found calcium oxalate crystals in Thompson's kidneys. The crystals can result from the body metabolizing antifreeze and are a strong indicator of the poison's presence.

Two months later, the state investigator confirmed evidence of antifreeze in Thompson's blood and urine "in sufficient quantities to cause death," said GBI spokesman John Bankhead.

The poisoning "could be accidental, could be suicide, it could be homicide," Bankhead said.

The GBI requested tissue slides for Turner's autopsy, conducted in 1995 by Cobb County medical examiner Dr. John Bankhead. The autopsy also found what appeared to be calcium oxalate crystals, but needed further testing to confirm it.

"In the kidney, we see crystals that are caused by various disease processes," Cobb County Medical Examiner Brian Bankhead said. The autopsy showed Turner had an enlarged heart and there was no reason to believe death was anything but natural, he said.

Due to the circumstances surrounding both men's deaths, Frist said he will order a second autopsy.

### News in Brief

#### Police arrest 33 in East Texas drug sweep

LONGVIEW (AP) — More than three dozen East Texas residents were arrested by a drug task force Tuesday on charges of trafficking crack cocaine.

Federal, state and local law officers made 33 arrests by 11 a.m. and continued seeking another 14 suspects.

The 17-month investigation uncovered three overlapping groups distributing crack cocaine from homes, street corners, parking lots and businesses in Longview, Gladewater and Carthage, authorities said. Most of the drugs were transported from Dallas and Houston to the Longview area.

Duncan Woodford, spokesman for Wes Rivers, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Texas, said he could not release the names of businesses allegedly involved in the trafficking.

Gregg County District Attorney Bill Jennings called the arrests "the first major roundup in five years."

violence is a cause of teens engaging in unhealthy behaviors or whether already troubled girls are more likely to date violent partners.

Silverman said some of the statistics and previous research suggest the violence likely preceded the unhealthy behavior.

Dr. Marla Kushner, director of adolescent medicine at Chicago's Weiss Memorial Hospital, said she suspects the problem may be more widespread than

Silverman's data suggest, so few blacks were sampled in previous studies found whites to report such violence.

The prevalence of dating and other sexual assault prompted the American Academy of Pediatrics in June to issue updated guidelines for pediatricians.

Citing statistics showing less than 1 percent of the nation's adolescent girls report rape, the academy's doctors should ask patients regular checkups if they've been sexually assaulted.
