News in Brief

Hospital loses removed organs

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — Oregon Health and Science University has apologized to the parents of a teen-ager after employees apparently lost the girl's heart and lungs removed during an autopsy.

Stephanie Cruzen, 16, died of a heart attack Dec. 7, three years after receiving a transplanted heart to correct an inherited cardiac disorder. Doctors at OHSU removed the organs and planned to send her heart and lungs to a specialist to pinpoint the cause of death.

"Everything would have been found in the heart and lungs," said her mother, Ann Cruzen. "It would have told us what happened to her. Now, it's just gone."

In a July 17 letter to the Cruzens, OHSU attorney Rodney Norton said officials believe the

organs were discarded by a temporary employee and cremated by mistake.

The Cruzens say they have filed notice of the intent to sue OHSU.

Purple ketchup coming soon

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Heinz is adding "Funky Purple" to its crayon box of condiment colors. Hoping to build on last year's success with "Blastin' Green" ketchup, the company said Tuesday the purple ketchup will be on store shelves in September.

In seven months, H.J. Heinz Co. sold more than 10 million bottles of green ketchup, pushing up total sales by 5.4 percent and helping the company boost its share of the U.S. ketchup market to 59 percent from 55 percent, spokesman Michael Mullen said.

drawing off the experience of his older brother Aaron, a cornerback for the New York Jets — did not seem to be surprised.

"Everybody's good, so it picks up quickly. I've got to move just as quick, or I'm going to get lost in the shuffle," he said. "When you think about that, it gets you to move just as quickly as the other guys."

So far, things have been going well for the new Lion. "I'm already up to the second string," Glenn said. "I'm going to keep working, so I can make an impact, and I can make a name for myself."

"I want to be able to fire up the fans up here the same way I used to at Kyle Field."

Glenn's injury caused him to go from being one of The Sporting News' Top 10 outside linebackers in the draft to a sixth-round pick. The Lions, with former NFL all-pro linebacker Matt Millen as their new general manager, did not pass on him. Glenn feels honored to have been drafted by someone with Millen's resume, which includes three Super Bowl rings.

"I see him as a great friend and a coach, not the president and CEO," Glenn said of Millen. "He comes out and does the drills with us, give us some tips ... he's really a great guy."

The Lions are holding camp in Saginaw, Michigan, which Glenn says is a long way from College Station.

"The other day, it got up to 85 (degrees), and some of the guys were dying out here," Glenn said. "I looked at them and said, 'This is great! This is like early morning in College Station!'"

Both the Lions and Aggies are having their chances for a good season discounted by

many, which offended Glenn. "A&M is always in the elite," he said. "Coach Slocum's great; coach Hank Hankwitz is great, and I hear this new guy for the offense (Dino Babers) is good too."

As for his new team, Glenn said, "Everyone's up here working real hard, and learning the system. If we keep working hard and stay healthy, we'll be good."

Glenn said that he is looking forward to playing in the NFL Central division against such

Glenn showed that he had not forgotten his Aggie roots with his message to the fans back in Texas "I'll always be an Aggie heart. I may wear blue, silver and grey now, but I'll always be maroon and white at heart. Tell 'em that I miss 'em and I hope to come down and see 'em when we beat the hell out of Texas."
