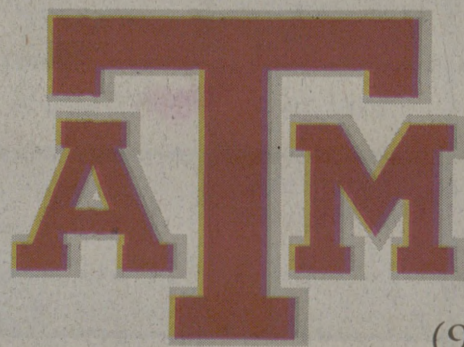

**Man gets 2 years for drug traffic**

HOUSTON — A 20-year-old man was sentenced to 2 years in prison for helping a woman smuggle marijuana from Mexico through drug rings in Harris County ranch land.

Frederico Perez was sentenced to 2 years in prison for a drug-traffic violation that transferred about 100,000 pounds of marijuana, U.S. Attorney A. Serres said Monday.

The organization, the South Texas patrol checkpoint, is patrolling the loads of marijuana on ranch roads, Serres said. Perez was arrested in 1999, reporting 599 pounds of marijuana, in another 22
