The investigation was named Operation Green Clover, for an Ecstasy pill in the shape of a clover. Fifty-five people were arrested in Colorado and California on Wednesday on state and federal charges. Eleven others were being sought.

The charges include distribution of Ecstasy, conspiracy and distribution resulting in death.

Officers in California and Colorado seized 85,000 Ecstasy tablets, 2.5 kilograms of cocaine, 320 pounds of marijuana, five pounds of methaphetamine, 40,000 doses of LSD, \$1.36 million in cash, 13 vehicles and 36 weapons, said Bob Castillo, head of the DEA office in Denver.

The investigation began after a Colorado state trooper made an arrest last August outside Colorado Springs and found Ecstasy pills. That resulted in the arrests of cadets at the Air Force Academy and airmen at various Colorado bases.
