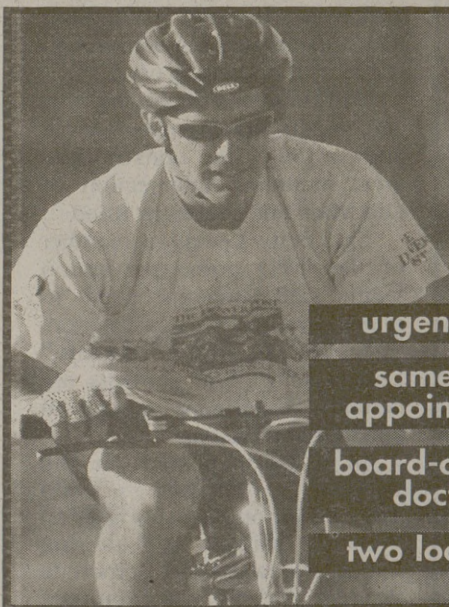

video from Allies where students talked about their experiences. Allies is a campus group of faculty, staff and students who support GLBTA students.

Although similar to Q-Camp and Transfer Camp, Q-Camp focuses more on a specific group of people and their needs instead of Aggie traditions.

"The reason Gender Issues started this event last year was to orient new gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered and allied students to this community," said Christina Gonzalez, graduate assistant for Gender Issues Education Services.

"They were all informed of their resources such as student groups, offices on campus, and affirming churches, etc. They were introduced to leadership opportunities within the GLBTA community. The students had the opportunity to meet with GLBTA and allied people so they did not feel so alone at this campus."

Gender Issues staff members are available to students for support and encouragement in person or over the phone. They work to help students in their experience and better informed of services and resources available to them on campus.

"Gender Issues would like to see the campers board member involved in some of the organizations that came to Q-Camp and hopefully, through the process that they met and the information that they received, safe and accepted on campus," Gonzalez said.

A&M football head coach R.C. Slocum also graduated from McNeese. Slocum was 11th in career receptions at McNeese State, where he played from 1964 to 1967.

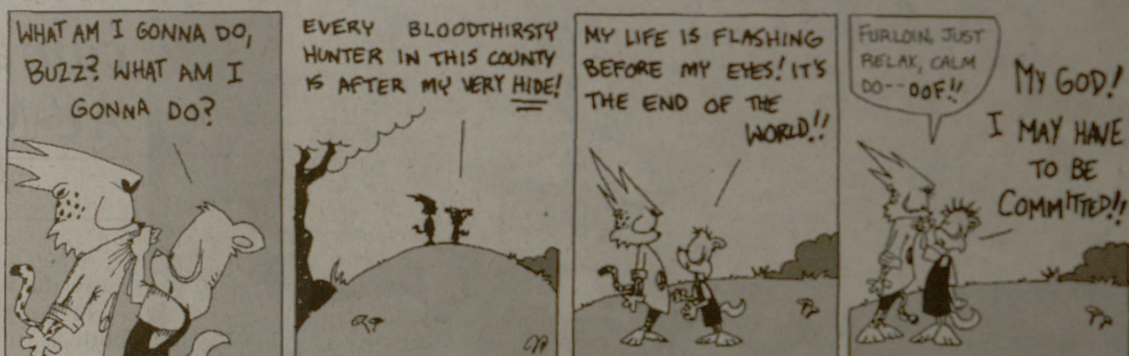
