Grandparents refused visitation to 8-year-old

DALLAS (AP)—The grandparents of a malnourished 10-year-old girl who was rescued in June after months of living in a lice-infested closet were told Tuesday they will not be allowed to visit the child's five brothers and sisters.

The children, who are now in protective custody, have not asked to see their grandparents, according to testimony at a hearing Tuesday before state District Judge Cheryl Lee Shannon.

The children's mother, Barbara Atkinson, 30, and stepfather, Kenneth Ray Atkinson, 33, have been indicted on charges of serious bodily injury to a child. If convicted, each could face five to 99 years or life in prison. They remain at the Lew Sterrett Justice Center in lieu of \$100,000 bail each.

A psychologist recommended the grandparents — Ms. Atkin-

son's parents, David and Doris Calhoun, and the stepfather's mother, Sheila White — be denied access to the children.

Tuesday's hearing did not involve the abused child, who is now 11 and reportedly thriving after being placed with a Van Zandt County couple who have begun adoption proceedings.

The girl, who weighed 25 pounds and was 3 feet tall when she was found, has gained 18 pounds and grown 3 inches, said Marleigh Meisner, a spokeswoman for Child Protective Services. She is learning to write her name and the alphabet and knows colors, Meisner said.

Meisner said the girl, who police and CPS officials have said was sexually abused, has no serious medical needs.

Regulatory officials had opposed visits between the grandparents and the five other chil-

dren, amid concerns about the youngsters' social maturity and skills.

At the hearing, a psychologist testified the oldest child in the family told her brothers and sisters she would deny them food and drink if they did not follow her orders.

Dr. Barbara Rila evaluated all six children.

"When a younger child is directing traffic around the house and giving out praise, giving out reprimands ... such as in the case of the oldest child, that would be inappropriate, to barter food for good behavior," Rila said.

She said the grandparents should have realized the children's needs were not being met and should have intervened.

Many of the girl's siblings suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder, but are flourishing in their new foster home, Rila said.

Officials ordered to release three public documents

MCKINNEY (AP) — Following a mandate from the attorney general's office, McKinney city officials have released to the media and attorneys three public documents concerning the June 5 shooting death of a woman in her home by a city police officer who was startled and thought the homeowner was an intruder.

One was the transcript and audiotape of the dispatch conversation of McKinney police dispatchers and police personnel, including officer Joyce VanDertuin, who shot Cathey Howard-Kalimah in an incident that McKinney police labeled an accident.

Another was the transcript and tape recording between the McKinney dispatcher and ADT Security, the company responsible for the Howard-Kalimah family's burglar alarm system.

The third transcript, also heard on the tape recording released, concerns the McKinney Fire Department, made at approximately 3:08 a.m. on the day after the shooting.

San Antonio officers fired in drug scandal

SAN ANTONIO (AP)—Two police officers have been fired for failing to report being asked to guard drug shipments as part of the federal sting that resulted in the arrests of 10 officers earlier this year, officials said.

Patrol Officers Thomas and Michael Pitts were terminated Aug. 22, but are fighting their dismissals, according to civil service records.

Two other officers whose names have not been released are also under investigation for allegedly breaking the same rules that require officers to report crimes, Philippus said.

Authorities are not claiming that the four officers participated in the drug scheme and say it is unlikely they will face criminal charges. In separate meetings with Philippus before the firings, Chonis and Pitts tried to sway the chief from dismissing them, said attorney Hao Le, who is representing both officers.

"We thought we were going to be able to end it there with the chief, but he decided against it," Le told the *San Antonio Express-News*. Chonis and Pitts plan to go before an arbitrator and ask to return to their posts.

Internal investigators believe Chonis remained silent last summer about an alleged request from fellow officer Patrick Bowron to protect drug shipments in exchange for money.

Bowron is facing several counts of attempting to distribute cocaine, and has been portrayed by federal prosecutors as a ringleader of the conspiracy.
