# Capital gains tax cut slated

WASHINGTON (AP) -Top congressional Republicans said Wednesday they want new legislation to stimulate the economy, including cuts in the capital gains tax rate, despite President Bush's wish to delay such an effort.

The GOP split emerged as Republicans stepped up efforts to combat Democratic was so costly that, unless savings are found, it could force the use of Social Security surpluses to pay for defense, education and other increases that both sides support.

In a private meeting, House GOP leaders decided to ask the White House to take administrative actions in to ensure that Social Security surpluses are not spent, Speaker Dennis Hastert, R-Ill., said in a brief interview.
