





Parks said that although the word "relocation" is in the title of the study he does not want residents of Brazos and Burleson

counties to assume that relocating the railroad is the only option. Charles Sippial Sr., a member of the MPO policy board and Texas A&M vice president for administration, said the setbacks

make immediate completion of the study impossible. "The new developments with the Federal Highway Administration that require us to have a primary and optional relocation plan with the completed [environmental] studies might set us back past the current January 2002 time period,"

Although new situations have arisen throughout the rail study, Sippial said that is not the only reason for the slow progress.
