Jayne Wittie, a member of Howdy Ags and a junior biomedical science major, said the organization. participates in events such as Howdy Week by getting local businesses involved, giving away prizes to those who exchange howdies and forming a "Howdy line" (wearing t-shirts that spell out --- you guessed it - "Howdy"). 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
