TX-TFI is managed by Texas Engineering Extension Service, a unit of the A&M University System. 70 members of TX-TFI placed on alert this morning the wake of the terrorist attack on New York and Washington, D.C., and hurried to assemble at College Station this afternoon.
"We got the first page on us on alert at 9:33 (a.m.), and got the call to go at 1:28," Todd Kahney, a member of task force and the Houston Department. "It doesn't get much time."
The team was to be deployed to New York from Eastern Airport via military on Tuesday night.
Members of other search rescue teams visiting Brayton Fire School were making preparations to head to New York. Chase Sargent, paramedic with the Virginia Beach Fire Department, among a group of firefighters from New Jersey, Florida, Massachusetts and Virginia were temporarily attached to TX-TFI.
Sargent, who was in College Station teaching a course on structural collapse, is a painful irony in today's event.
"I was in New York in Oklahoma City (the bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building) happened, but I was here for the Bonfire (collapsing). Now I'm here, and this happened in New York," he said.
TX-TFI is one of Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) teams and is "trained work in hazardous environments," said Dr. G. Ken Bennett, director of the Engineering Extension Service. "We're just waiting for the come and lift us out."
Tim Gallagher, TX-TFI team commander, said his team is "as used to death as you get to it."
However, Gallagher said, loss of life among the New York City Police and Fire departments makes them more than before.
"This changes the focus a little bit," Gallagher said. "It has an effect on their psyche, but we have to make sure their focus is on rescue."
The members of TX-TFI were still stunned Tuesday evening that such a horrific attack had taken place, but were prepared to go to New York in hope of finding survivors.
"It's going to be strange seeing the World Trade Center," Hubbard said. "You really don't want to know what we think (the terrorists). You can't have any respect for folks like that."

because of former President Bush's involvement in the Gulf War.
The Bush Library has been put on a security alert on previous occasions following acts of terrorism in other parts of the world.
Speaking from former President Bush's summer residence in Maine, Bush spokesman Tom Frechette declined to comment on Bush's whereabouts, but said the former president's Secret Service detail was on high alert.
Bush was scheduled to be in Houston today to attend an event for the Houston Texans, the city's National Football League franchise, but sponsors canceled the event, Frechette said.
Bush was the target of a foiled assassination plot in 1993 while on a trip to Kuwait.
