Blood donors respond to NYC, D.C. attacks

Scores of people lined up across Bryan-College Station Tuesday to donate blood in the wake of the terrorist attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C.

Tyler Foster, a freshman electrical engineering major, said that he donated blood immediately after he heard about the attacks.

"As soon as I heard about it on the news, I was gone," Foster said.

Theresa Evangelista, American Red Cross territory manager for the Bryan-College Station area, said the wait to give blood was an estimated four hours.

"At this point, we've been getting a tremendous response," Evangelista said. "We appreciate people coming out, but anticipate that there will be a wait because we do have a limited number of staff."

The center will remain open from 6

a.m. until 9 p.m. through the week, because of the blood shortage in New York City.

"People are welcome to appointments in advance, or just in," Evangelista said.

The Carter Blood Center is located at Sbis Dining Center Memorial Student Center (MS) the Commons Lobby, will be their hours.

"We will open at 8 a.m. Wednesday and will continue to open as long as needed," said Wallace, supervisor of the MSC.

Olivia Davila, a junior computer health major, said the news attacks prompted her to donate at Sbis location.

"We need to donate anyway, considering the circumstances of what we decided to come out sooner than normally would have," Davila said. "We need blood and we need more."

Staff from both centers said blood types are needed.
