**Attack's effects felt in Houston
Bush, Hobby airports close in wake of tragedy**

Tuesday morning's attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C., disrupted businesses and commerce throughout the Houston area and have sent FBI officials in Houston into a state of high alert.

Several buildings in the downtown area were evacuated or closed Tuesday morning after news spread about the incidents in the Northeast.

Houston's William P. Hobby and Bush Intercontinental airports were closed at approximately 8 a.m., after the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) mandated all domestic commercial air travel be halted.

Ellington Air Force Base, which serves both military and civilians, also was closed. The base is the home of the Texas Air National Guard and the 147th Fighter Wing.

Officials at the Texas Air National Guard declined to go into detail, saying only that Ellington was "on alert."

Ellington, 15 miles south of downtown Houston, also is used by NASA, Continental Airlines Express and United Parcel Service.

The ban on commercial flights is expected to be removed at noon today. After the

The tallest building in the state, the Building, also closed, as well as the Shell oil plants in the New York and Texas areas.

FBI headquarters in Houston increased security after the unexpected events of Tuesday.

"It was a state of shock," said Special Agent Bob Dogium, on duty about the attacks. "We were no different than anyone else who was watching were surprised in many ways."

The University of Saint Thomas, Montgomery College, Tomball College, Alvin Community College all closed classes Tuesday.

Officials in Dallas were taking precautions as well, sending bomb-sniffing teams throughout the Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport.
