

Tuesday morning's attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C., disrupted businesses and commerce throughout the Houston area and have sent FBI officials in Houston into a state of high alert.

Several buildings in the downtown area were evacuated or closed Tuesday morning after news spread about the incidents in the

Houston's William P. Hobby and Bush Intercontinental airports were closed at approximately 8 a.m., after the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) mandated all domestic commercial air travel be halted.

Ellington Air Force Base, which serves both military and civilians, also was closed. The base is the home of the Texas Air National Guard and the 147th Fighter Wing. Officials at the Texas Air National

Guard declined to go into detail, saying only that Ellington was "on alert."


