of Bryan, said residents be aware of who they are dealing with and what charity represent.

"They may tell you that a certain amount of money will be a relief fund ... you have to be of knowing if that is true," Lightfoot said. "Make sure you know who you're talking to."

Lightfoot said identifying a scam can be a difficult, lengthy process. However, said contributors should be of appeals that are long and short on details, what the charity will address specific needs of victims. He also warned donors never to give out social security numbers.

The FBI, U.S. Inspection Service, and the attorney general's office, other local and state agencies will have their ears to reports of fraudulent charities purporting to be raising for terrorist attack relief.

"Many fine, legitimate charities stand ready to help encourage your support," Texas Attorney General Cornyn is a statement on Monday. "However, Americans can be certain unscrupulous individuals will come forward exploit this outpouring of will across the nation. Don't people like this have one enriching themselves in deception in the midst of mous human suffering?"

A spokesperson at the resident agency in Bryan people should validate a charity is a credible relief. "If there is doubt, it is best not to send money until you have done some investigation on your own," she said. "Something in writing who they are."

Nonetheless, she said doubt exists, well-known ties such as the American Cross are usually a safe gains tax on the sale of stocks, real estate and other assets.
