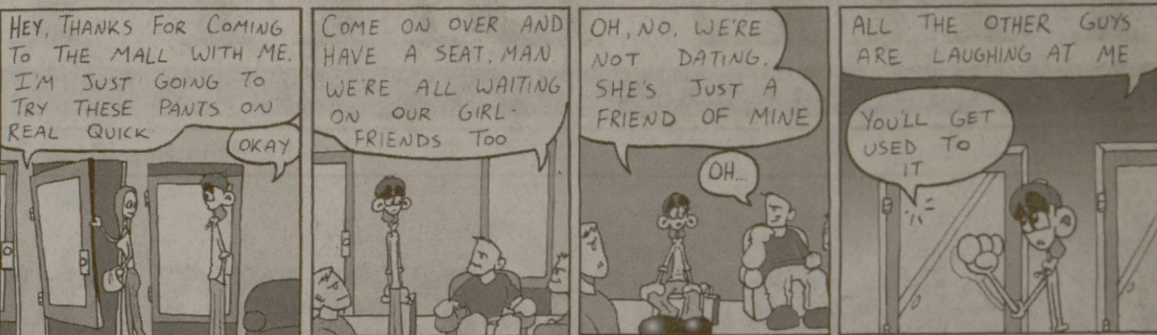

Students involved actively participate in the Fest International Film Festival and the Texas Film Festival. Barbara Finley, director of women's studies, says the purpose of the program is often because some cannot look the feminist image that name evokes.

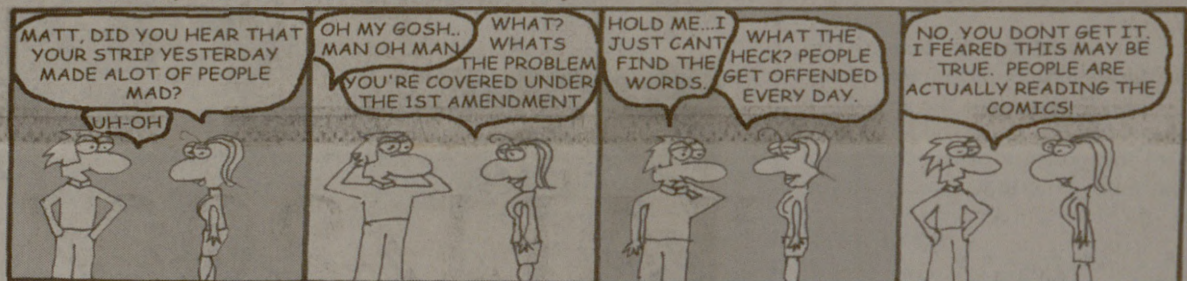
