

4-0 to the Cornhuskers. In their second Big 12 game, the Bears fell 2-1 in overtime to Iowa State. It was the first time Baylor had lost to the Cyclones.

While freshman forward Linsey Johnson has been outstanding for the Aggies, Baylor has its own freshman phenomenon in forward April Robertson. Robertson is leading the Bears with five goals, but she did not score a goal in either of the Bear's Big 12 games.

Before the showdown with Baylor, the Aggies first face the Houston Cougars tonight. The Cougars are 2-5-1 and 1-

3 in Conference USA, but Guerrieri said his team can not overlook them. "We don't look at it that way,"

Guerrieri said. "If you look at it that way, Colorado wasn't a very good team. It will be a huge game for them and they will play very hard and physical. Colorado upset the Aggies by

tying them 2-2 in Boulder last Sunday. They came into the game with a record of 1-5.

The Aggies had tough road

trips during the last two weeks, facing No. 4 Portland and No. Washington Husky/Nike Invitational and then opening Big 12 play at Texas Tech and Colorado. However, the Aggies managed to escape with a 2-1-1 record in those games, 4-2-1 overall.


