

Dr. Arvind Mahajan, finance professor, said it is still too soon to predict what long term policy changes will result from the terrorist attacks.

There is no historic precedence in U.S. history of such an event, hence, it is clearly hazardous to forecast in a meaningful way what possible changes

will emerge from this event, so this discussion is very important," Mahajan said.

Dr. Charles Hermann, a political science professor and associate dean of the George Bush School of Government and Public Service said the United States is entering a new era in which private organizations like terrorist groups impact international relations.

Discussing national security

issues, Col. Joseph Cerami, a lecturer at the Bush School, said homeland defense must become a top priority not just for domestic law enforcement, but also for international policy makers.

"We have to think in broad terms when looking at the linkage of domestic and international politics, or 'intermestic' issues,' Cermi said. "We are living in an important historical time; pay attention and stay tuned."


