"The biggest thing she is doing right now is that she is not trying to do everything," Guerrieri said. "She is very good at helping us connect the midfield and the front line."

"Last week, I was back in coverage a lot," Penright said. "I had to be a little more subtle because of the pass. Hopefully, I can have the opportunity to blitz and chase the quarterback this week."

On special teams, the Wildcats have one of the most dangerous kick returners in the nation in senior Aaron Lockett. The wide receiver averages 36.6 yards per game returning kicks good for second in the nation. Lockett has returned a kickoff for a touchdown this season, one of just 19 division I-A players to do so this season.

The Wildcats, looking for their first win since Sept. 22, and the Aggies will kick off at 11:30 a.m. Saturday.

"If they were undefeated right now, or if they lost one or two, I feel like we are going to get their best shot," Slocum said. "Our games have been very competitive, and I am sure this will be no different."

No. 17 A&M hosts Missouri Saturday

The No. 17 Texas A&M volleyball team will be looking for a season sweep of Missouri as the Aggies host the Tigers on Saturday at 7 p.m. at G. Rollie White Coliseum.

In its Big 12 opener, A&M (13-3, 6-2 Big 12) defeated Missouri (15-4, 6-4 Big 12) in a thrilling five set match, 30-28, 27-30, 23-30, 30-23, 15-13.

Since that match, the Aggies have been road warriors in Big 12 play, but have not quite gotten on track at G. Rollie White.

In Big 12 play, the Aggies are a perfect 5-0 on the road, and are 10-0 on the road for the season. At home however, the Aggies have just won once in three tries.

The Aggies are coming off a 30-27, 26-30, 30-25, 30-21 victory over Kansas in Lawrence, Kan., on Wednesday.

Senior setter Jenna Moscovic led the Aggies, posting her fourth triple double of the season with 12 kills, 56 assists and

a season-high 17 digs. Missouri is coming off a victory over No. 20 Colorado, one of the teams that defeated A&M at home, on Wednesday in Missouri, 30-26, 18-30, 30-23, 30-22.

The Tigers have won four straight matches and six of their last eight.
