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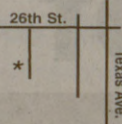

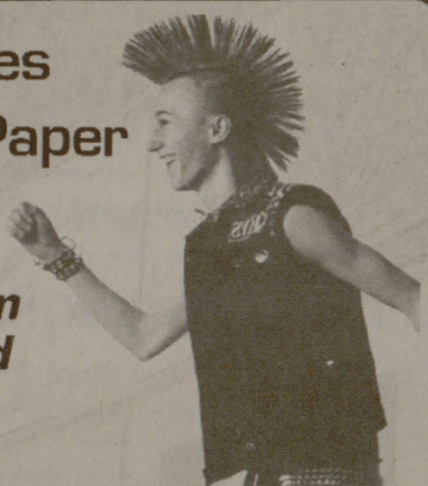

Houser said she thinks reaching her campaign goals slowly but surely.

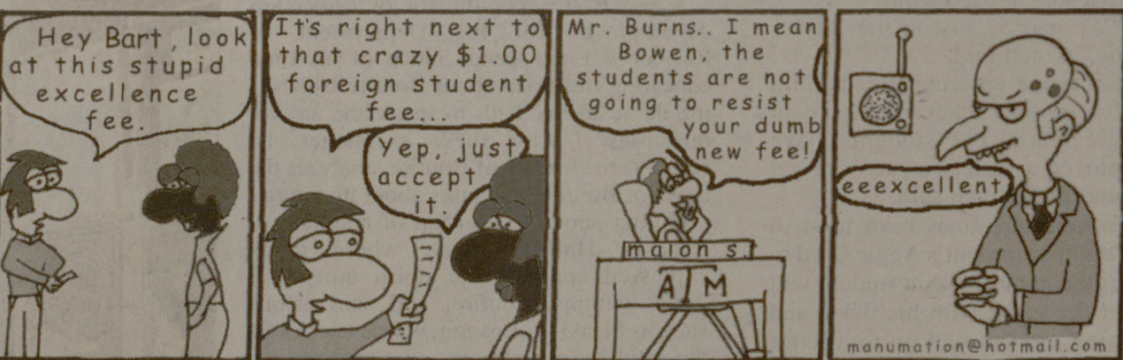

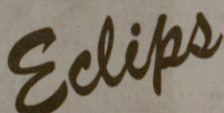

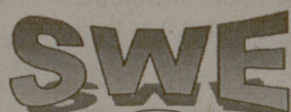
