During the temporary relocation of the tracks, students will be able to access West Campus with the temporary ramps that will be placed around areas of construction, Sippial said.

"This project won't cause any trouble for the students," he said.

The underground passageway is part of a two-year construction project.

"They are already excavating the ground for the 3,700-space parking garage," Sippial said "In 10 months, they will be ready to shift the rail to build a portion of the underground passageway, and when they are through with that, the rail will be shifted back to its original location."

Sippial said that students who in the past have had to find potentially dangerous ways over the tracks — including instances in which students crossed the tracks between stopped railroad cars — spurred the idea for an underground walkway.

"We're building this underpass because we need a safe passageway for the students," Sippial said.

During construction, the tracks will be displaced 10-12 feet, Sippial said.
