Wiatt said the Bush library is the only location on campus with heightened security. There are no known or immediate threats or indications of any threats to the Bush complex or any other location

on campus, Wiatt said. These are only precautionary measures, and there is no need for panic or fear, Wiatt said. Further security measures are not planned, but if a threat seems possible, action will be taken.

Wiatt also said that this is not a time for practical jokes or tests on security measures.

“Jokes will not be tolerated with anthrax or anything else. Anything like this will be dealt with in the most serious manner,” Wiatt said.

Blake said the library was the most likely site on campus to become a potential terrorist target.

“I think an attack on this particular facility would be used to symbolically affect President George W. Bush, and of course in response to the former president’s (George H. W. Bush) involvement in the Gulf War,” Blake said.

In addition to his many offices and chairmanships, Hobby has been honored numerous times, named a Distinguished Alumnus by Rice University President Emeritus by the Texas Senate and given the Santa Rita Award.

Hobby also holds doctorates from four universities.

“It was patriotism,” he said. In 1998, Olson came to A&M as an officer-in-charge to teach at the George Bush School of Government and Public Service. He became permanent faculty member August 2000 and retired from the CIA in the summer of 2001.

“I had the privilege of working under George Bush,” Olson said. “He was international affairs and security in the curriculum, was asked to come here.”

Olson teaches a senior political science course on War intelligence, and two late courses on U.S. intelligence and national security and national crisis management serves as the Director of the George Bush Center for Intelligence. He is also involved in establishing a new master’s program in international studies starting next fall. Olson said a prospect of an internal program at A&M is exciting because there are few schools in the nation with this type of program.

Even though he is retired from the CIA, Olson consulted on issues regarding the rebuilding of U.S. intelligence.

He said there is a possibility of being asked back to Washington D.C., but he would like to stay here.

“My wife and I love the area,” Olson said. “I am impressed by the students. The patriotism, values, and integrity of so many students is something I have seen anywhere else.”

of Health in Austin for further testing if needed.

This call was the first one warranted close analysis, Humphreys said.

Humphreys said the number of phone calls regarding anthrax attacks in other parts of the country.

“I can count on one hand the number of call regarding suspicious packages [in the department] has had in my years here,” Humphreys said. “But in the last two weeks, are probably averaging one call a day.”

Humphreys said it was possible that paper powder could be packed with the paper, but said it is better to err on the side of safety with dealing with arduous materials and suspicious packages.

The firefighters worked two and a half hours to seal the building and the substance. The offices are located at 11111 Welsh Avenue next to the Checkers Gas Station, Holleman. The offices will be closed tomorrow and most through the weekend.

While it will take three days to find out the results of the test the city has already determined how to deal with the case.

“Something like this is considered criminal until we determine otherwise,” Humphreys said.
