You can come in contact with it in three ways - through the skin, inhalation and intestinal, which is contracted through contaminated meat," Moyes said.

Once an individual comes in contact with the anthrax bacteria, it can have an incubation period of about seven days, she added.

"A treatment of drugs needs to start right after the first signs appear," Moyes said. "Antibiotics kill some of the time, but due to toxins the antibiotic can sometimes have no effect."

Ward said approximately thirty parcels have been collected in Bryan-College Station and surrounding areas, most turning out to be scam and diet letters, Ward said.


