Qualifications for editor in chief of *The Battalion* are:

- Be a Texas A&M student in good standing with the University and enrolled in at least six credit hours (4 if a graduate student) during the term of office (unless fewer credits are required to graduate);
- Have at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point ratio (3.00 if a graduate student) and at least a 2.00 grade point ratio (3.00 if a graduate student) in the semester immediately prior to the appointment, the semester of appointment and semester during the term of office. In order for this provision to be met, at least six hours (4 if a graduate student) must have been taken for that semester;
- Have completed JOUR 301 (Mass Communication, Law and Society), or equivalent;
- Have at least one year experience in a responsible editorial position on *The Battalion* or comparable daily college newspaper,

"The actions of a group of students tarnished an important victory by our football team not only tearing down the goalposts, but also by carrying goalposts and making an attempt to place it in the A&M section," said Texas A&M Director of Athletics Greg Meyers in a written statement.

"This behavior is an embarrassment to the university and will not be condoned by the Tech. On behalf of the university, I want to apologize to the A&M for the behavior of a group of students who acted irresponsibly. This type of behavior will not be tolerated and we will take steps to ensure it doesn't happen again."

McKinney was named Perry's chief of staff Aug. 2001. He was Texas Health Human Services Commissioner under President George Bush during his tenure as governor of Texas.

not clear who was going to be the staff member on the trip. It's very difficult to staff the trip. After Sept. 11, that gave us the momentum to call it off."

He said the cancellation had nothing to do with the Rowan debacle. An investigation by University officials examined allegations of alcohol abuse, inappropriate sexual advances and illegal drug use by Rowan. The findings have not been made public. Rowan acknowledged drinking too much, but has denied the other allegations.

Tom Fitzhugh, a Houston lawyer and fundraiser for the trip, said concern for participants' safety is one of the reasons that the trip was canceled.

"The trip has been postponed until 2002 due to concerns following September

11," Fitzhugh said. "Nothing mysterious about it. I'm not sure we could muster enough students and allay concerns about safety for such a trip at this time."

Kristi Zipp, a senior marketing major, participated in the London trip in March 2000 and said she enjoyed the experience.

"I met so many cool people — lots of people in the MSC and leaders around campus," Zipp said. "You're seeing a different culture and networking with fellow and old Ags. You're having a blast walking around seeing things that have been there for hundreds of years and it's mind-boggling."

Fitzhugh said the trip's hiatus is temporary.

"The trip has been a wonderful part of the MSC and my life, and I certainly expect it to continue," Fitzhugh said.
