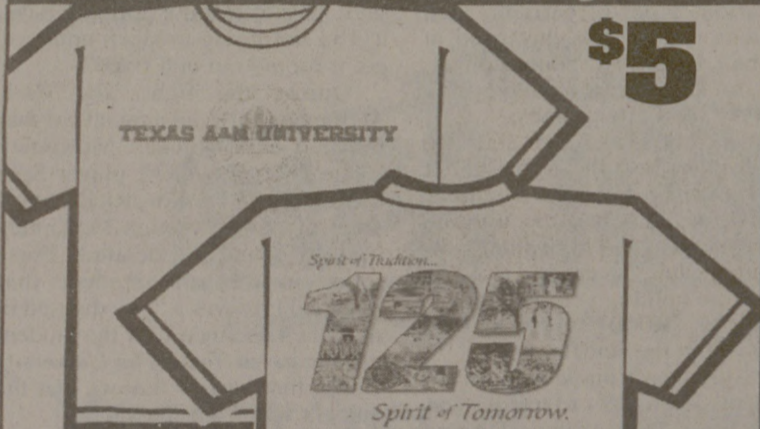

Big 12 Conference spokesman Bo Carter said the league would investigate receiving written reports from the game from both sides, expected this week.

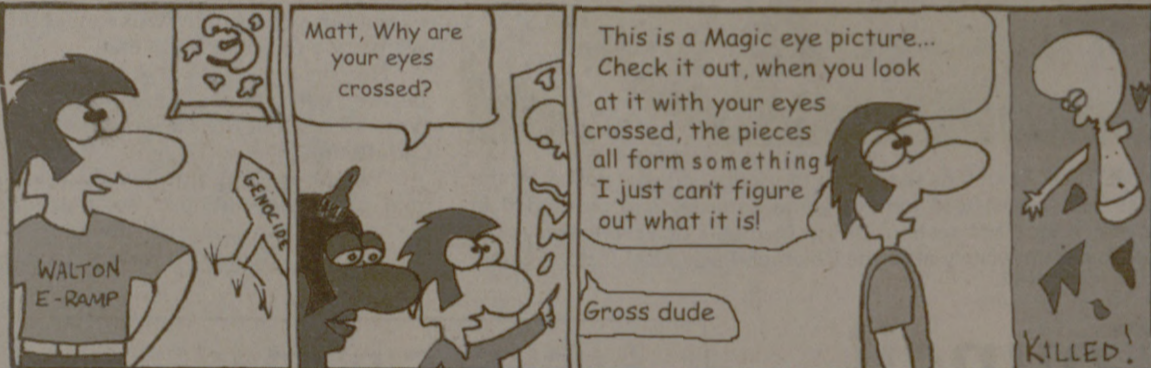

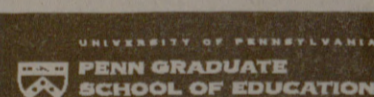
