Texas A&M junior cross country runner Juan DeBastos will be the only Aggie continuing the season Monday at the 2001 NCAA Division I Championships in Greenville, S.C.

DeBastos earned a spot in the tournament with his sixthplace finish at the South Central Regional at the Texas A&M Golf Course. DeBastos was running the 10K race for the first time this season and impressed men's head crosscountry coach Dave Hartman.

"Juan ran a great race," Hartman said. "He ran a smart race this weekend. He made his way up in the pack and qualified for the NCAA's.

The race will be at Furman University and will bring together the top 38 individual racers in the men's and women's categories, as well as the nation's top 31 teams. The A&M men's team missed the automatic qualification when it placed fourth at the regional. The top two teams from the South Central Regional, the University of Texas-Austin and the University of Arkansas, qualified for the Championships.
